A Word Of Encouragement

- Dealing with children can sometimes be challenging. You will make mistakes as you begin to implement any new technique so don't be too hard on yourself. When you mess up do the following:
 - Admit you messed up
 - 4 Apologize if necessary

- 👃 Make amends
- 👃 Move forward

This is what I call leading by example. Sometimes there is more value in correcting the mess up than in what you were trying to accomplish in the first place.

2. Different techniques work better with one child than with another. In other words you will need to try out the different techniques and determine which ones work best with what child.

Don't give up too easily. If you try a technique and you see no immediate result refrain from thinking that this technique doesn't work. Depending on the child you may need to try it as many as 7 times or more before you see the desired result.
